Annie Ree Brantley-Summers was born and raised in Forsyth and Monroe County, and graduated from Hubbard High School in 1952. Athletically, she was a good and fast basketball player and track athlete at Hubbard, and played in State basketball and track tournaments and events, winning trophies in basketball, and the 100-yard dash high jump, and other track events. After graduation from Hubbard, she attended Columbia Hospital School of Nursing and earned a nursing degree in 1955, and then attended North Carolina Central earning a BA degree, with further studies on a Master's Degree at the University of Minnesota. She is believed to have been the first African-American from Hubbard in Forsyth to receive a RN nursing degree. She and her husband now reside in Maryland and have three daughters.
