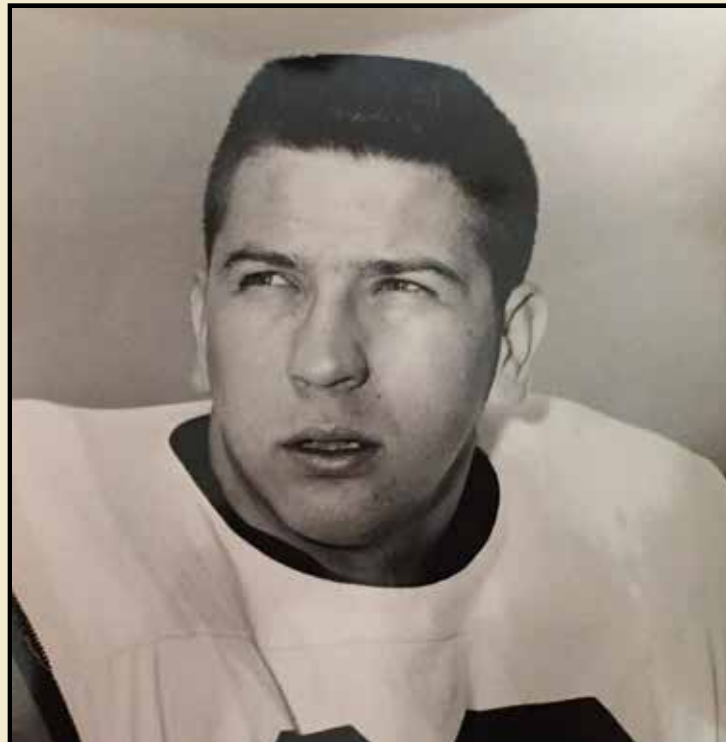

Charles Dumas



Charles Dumas starred as a fullback at MPHS from the 1957 through 1960 seasons, first under Coach Harold Garrett, and then under Dan Pitts. He began his career as an offensive lineman as a Freshman and Sophomore, but under Pitts moved to the backfield for his Junior and Senior years. As a Junior for the 1959 Bulldogs, Dumas led the scoring with seven touchdowns and again scored seven touchdowns to lead the scoring for the 1960 team. From Mary Person, Dumas moved on to Clemson University for the 1961 through 1964 seasons, scoring five touchdowns for the Tigers in his career, and was the number five scorer for rushing touchdowns in the ACC, for touchdowns from scrimmage in the ACC and for points scored in the ACC for the 1962 ACC season. After graduation from Clemson, Dumas served as an assistant coach for Dan Pitts and taught at Mary Persons, was named Principal of MP Junior High School for two years, and in 1975 took office as Monroe County School Superintendent, a position in which he served for 25 years. Charles and wife, Patricia live in Forsyth.
